2016 Annual Meeting - Goals / Plans for 2017

Taking office in January of 2016, the newly-elected board hit the ground running. During our first year we established short and long-term goals.

Our short term goals for this year were:

- **Create a budget** We are pleased to tell you that we are very close to finalizing our first-ever budget. Thank you Tom Maley, Tom Felegle and Rich Laychock. We are hoping to have the budget approved at our January 2017 Board meeting.
- **Promote membership and actively recruit new members** Since January, 111 new members have joined the Carpatho-Rusyn Society.
- **Provide better communication** The New Rusyn Times is being published on time. We have created an online monthly bulletin we call C-RS Connect. Our calendar of events is regularly being updated on our website. We also have a half-hour <u>Rusyn Radio Program</u> on WPIT 730 AM at 2:30 p.m. every Sunday.
- Hold Events at the Cultural Center We have held three events at the Center this year, The Sock

Hop Dance, Sing-along with Jerry Jumba and a presentation by Professor Bob Magocsi.

• **Provide guidance to chapters and to give them a sense of direction** – The Chapters are being regularly updated by Sharon Jarrow and Bonnie Burke. The needs of the Chapters are our priority and we try to address them in a timely matter.

• **Involve our youth** – We presented a pysanky demonstration and taught Rusyn dances at the Byzanteen rally. This went so well received that we've been asked to participate again in two years. We are also preparing care packages for college-bound students. This project was conceived by Laurel Tombazzi's daughter and we are grateful to her for this brilliant idea. Bettianne Diles and her daughter Veronica are taking over this project.

• **Organize and document the artifacts at the Cultural Center** – Max Adzima, an intern at the Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation and guide at Frank Lloyd Wright's "Fallingwater" is cataloging our newsletters, magazines, books and artifacts.

Our plans for 2017 include:

The life of "Mr. Manville (NJ)," George Papawick, civic leader and four-time elected town mayor, was recently featured in the Somerset County Historical Society Newsletter.

The article was written by his daughter Pat Beronio, a member of the C-RS and the Somerset Historical Society. Beronio outlined her father's 40 years of civic achievement in Manville prior to his death from Leukemia in 1968.

Papawick was born in 1905 to Rusyn immigrants and was highly regarded throughout New Jersey as a role model for all, especially in the Rusyn and Greek Catholic communities. Beronio is currently writing a book about her father's life.

Rusyn Holy Supper Recipe (Christmas Eve)

Sauerkraut Mushroom Soup

(Courtesy of Maryann Sivak)

package of sauerkraut
onion
glove garlic
bay leaf
small package of sliced mushrooms
tbs oil (I use avocado)
tbs flour



Salt/pepper to taste

Drain sauerkraut - reserve the juice.

In a soup pot melt 2 tbs of oil. When oil is hot add drained sauerkraut, chopped onion and thinly sliced (chopped) garlic.

Saute for about 5 minutes occasionally stirring. Then lover the heat, cover the soup pot and cook on low heat stirring occasionally for about 20 minutes.

Add 7 cups of cold water, bay leaf, and sliced mushroom. Bring water to boil, then lower the heat, cover the soup pot and cook for about an hour. Add "zaprazhka"

Season to taste with salt and pepper and sauerkraut juice (optional) - Serve.

Prepare "zaprazhka" (roux). Heat 2 tbs of oil Add 2 tbs of flour - stir until brown Add 1/2 cup of water - stir and cook until it thickens (about 2-3 minutes).
