## Studium Carpatho-Ruthenorum Scholarships

Three University students from Slovakia and Ukraine have received scholarships to the Studium Carpatho-Ruthenorum International Summer School for Rusyn Language and Culture through a \$1600 donation by the Carpatho-Rusyn Society. The recipients include Karina Muliar from the Ukraine and Marian Hapak and Tomas Badanic, both from Slovakia.

For the past seven years the International Summer School has been held in June at the Institute of Rusyn Language and Culture at Prešov University in Prešov, Slovakia. Participants attend lectures in Carpatho-Rusyn history and culture, specifically ethnography/folklore, as well as language classes at the beginning and advanced levels over the course of three weeks.

Parallel instruction is offered in English and in Rusyn, and instructors include faculty from Prešov University's Institute of Rusyn Language and Culture, as well as from Ukraine, and from North American universities. Participants also enjoy excursions to places and institutions significant to Carpatho-Rusyns, including the Andy Warhol Museum of Modern Art in Medzilaborce, Carpathian wooden churches, the famous icon museum in Bardejov, a folk festival in Svidnik, and more. Workshops in pysanky, Rusyn folksong and dance, and explorations on foot of "Carpatho-Rusyn Prešov" with its Orthodox and Byzantine Catholic Cathedrals and the new Rusyn Museum are also offered.

Students, registered in U.S. universities and colleges, who have requested scholarship funds when applying for the Studium have been able to procure them from generous donations from organizations, such as the Carpatho-Rusyn Society, the Rusin Association of Minnesota, the Lemko Association, and the Carpatho-Rusyn Research Center, as well as from alumni and other generous individual donors.

These funds have made possible the participation of a number of students over the past few years and have been enormously appreciated. Potential donors are reminded that it is through this kind of education and the passing on of information that Carpatho-Rusyn Studies, as well as Carpatho-Rusyn identity and culture, will be perpetuated.
